Thank you for your entry in the **2009 Australian International 3 Day Event**. Your cooperation is requested with all the administrative arrangements that have been put in place to ensure the smooth, efficient and effective running of the 2009 Australian International 3 Day Event. Listed below are some of the arrangements. Please take time to read this information as it covers a wide range of issues affecting competitors, administrators and officials.

**SMOKE FREE**

- In 2009, the Australian International 3 Day Event is a **Smoke Free Zone**. Players, coaches, trainers, staff, volunteers and officials are to refrain from smoking while they are acting in an official capacity, whilst in uniform or wearing health promotion clothing, whilst competing, in the stable block or campground and whilst on any other part of the event site.

### **ARRIVAL PROCEDURE**

- **Competitors planning to arrive prior to 8.00am, Tuesday 10 November must liaise with the secretary – Andrea Goddard on 0407 717 837**
- **Competitors are required to report to the Secretary's Office to register their arrival at which time you will be given bridle numbers, allocated camp site positions, grooms and owners, etc. at this time, riders will also need to present to the Secretary's Office with 2 photocopies of their medical armband which will be retained.**

### **BIOSECURITY**

#### **Queensland.**

Hay from any parts of Queensland is normally prohibited into South Australia because of the detected pest Red Imported Fire Ant (RIFA). However, on the basis that Qld DPI are undertaking an active monitoring and eradication program, the movement of hay into SA will require each participant to obtain a plant health certificate from DPI Queensland or a Plant Health Assurance Certificate from an accredited business. The certificate will be issued to certify :

1. That the hay has originated from within 5 kms of a known outbreak of RIFA and that the source property has been monitored and found free of RIFA or the hay has been fumigated with Methyl Bromide; or
2. That the hay has been sourced from a property located greater than 5 kms from any known or suspect outbreak of RIFA.

#### **Western Australia**

Hay from Western Australia is restricted due to the confirmed presence of the pest Green Snail. Participants from WA will require to obtain a Plant Health Certificate from WA Ag certifying that either the hay has originated from within 25 kms of a known detection of green snail and that the source property has been baited and found to be free from green snail; or grown greater than 25 kms from any known detection of green snail.

#### **Northern Territory, New South Wales, Victoria & Tasmania.**

Hay originating from these States and Territory can enter South Australia unrestricted and without the need for a certificate. It would be wise for participants to ensure that the bottoms of the baled hay are free of soil.

### **Other Important Quarantine Information**

**Participants travelling into South Australia must be aware that it is an offence under the Plant Health Act 2009 to carry any uncertified fruit or vegetables into South Australia. Penalties up to \$20,000 can apply to any person found in breach of Section 7 (7), Plant Health Act 2009. ### **IDENTIFICATION NUMBERS**

- All competitors will be issued on arrival with bridle numbers. These must be worn by the horse **at all times** when the horse leaves the stable, including whilst being exercised.

**All competitors will be required to have their own Cross Country Back Number Holder and Medical Armband for Cross Country.**

### **MEDICAL ARMBANDS**

- All riders in all classes must wear correctly fitting Medical Armbands on their arms for the Endurance Test.
- All riders must present **2 photocopies of their Medical Armband details** to the Secretary's Office on arrival. These will be retained by the Medical Officer, and if he/she has any medical queries, these will be followed up ASAP.

### **ARRIVAL EXAMINATIONS**

- All horses stabled at Victoria Park must have an arrival examination. This includes all CIC\*\* horses.
- Arrival examinations will take place in the car park by the main entrance and all riders are required to present their horses between 9:00am to 11am and 2pm to 4pm on Tuesday 10 and Wednesday 11 November.
- If you have 'companion' horses at the venue, these must also be presented for examination and arrangements must be made prior to the event with the event secretary.
- Veterinary Officials will carry out Arrival Examinations.
- **All CCI \*\*\*\* Competitors must present an FEI Passport. CCI \*\* and CIC \*\* Competitors must present an FEI Passport or EFA ID Document with your horse at the arrival examination.** These documents will be retained by the Organising Committee until the end of the competition when competitors will be responsible for requesting their return.
- Competitors or connections entering horses for competition or presenting horses for inspection at competitions without valid National Identification Documents will be fined \$100.00.
- Horses for which no EFA National Identification Document has been recorded as issued and validated will be refused a start and the competitor fined \$100.00 (unless the horse has a valid FEI passport).
- A mandatory registration of all riders and horses competing in FEI Eventing competitions has been introduced in the FEI Rules for Eventing 23<sup>rd</sup>. Edition, 1<sup>st</sup> January 2009, updated 30<sup>th</sup> June 2009 Articles 511.1 and 511.2. All horses and riders need to be registered with the FEI annually before competing at any level of

International Eventing Competitions regardless of whether they already hold an FEI passport and/or have already competed at international level.

### **ARENA ORIENTATION FOR CCI\*\*\*\* HORSES**

#### **Wednesday 11 November 1:00pm – 3:00pm**

- An orientation of the CCI\*\*\*\* arena has been arranged to allow CCI\*\*\*\* competitors to familiarise their horses with the competition environment prior to the competition day.
- Horses will be marshalled across Wakefield Road at 20 minute intervals in groups of 10.
- This will allow horses approximately 15 minutes on the main area around the dressage arenas.
- There will be a timetable posted on the stable noticeboard.
- On arrival you must write your name in one of the specified times if you wish to take advantage of this option.
- This option is only available for four star horses.

### **VENUE ARRANGEMENTS**

- Dressage (CCI\*\*\*\*) will be held in Rymill Park on Friday 13 November.
- Dressage (CCI\*\*/CIC\*\*) will be held on CBC middle oval Friday 13 November.
- Cross County phase will be held on Saturday 14 November.
- Showjumping will be held in Rymill Park on Sunday 165 November.

### **PARKING**

- Please take note of the allocation of parking areas.
- Campground competitors are asked to park only in their allocated site.
- Competitors are asked to park only in their allocated site.
- If you have **not paid** for a camping site or advised who you are camping with, your vehicle will not be allowed to enter the site and amenities will not be available to you.

### **PROHIBITED AREAS**

- Smoking and Alcohol are prohibited in the stable area.

### **EXERCISE AREAS & TIMES**

- Horses may be exercised/schooled only in areas designated by the Organising Committee.
- Areas and times will be designated for jumping schooling.
- Exercising/Schooling details will be posted on the Official Notice Board & Stable Notice Board.
- For their own safety, riders are asked to advise an on-duty steward of their expected departure and return times if they wish to hack horses in the allocated parkland areas.

### **HORSE ACCOMODATION**

- Please report to the stable manager upon arrival for your stable allocation.
- Competitors are reminded that the stable block is a **restricted area**. Only riders, grooms and owners are permitted in the stabling area. Security personnel will be

monitoring stable access for the duration of the event. **Unauthorised personnel are not permitted in the stable block at any time.**

- Horses **must** occupy their allocated stable.
- **All horses MUST be accommodated on the venue and are not permitted to leave for any reason until after the completion of the Show Jumping for the class entered unless a “Withdrawal Notification” is completed. Forms available from the secretary’s office.**

## **ABSOLUTELY NO BUILDING OF ELECTRIC OR ANY YARDS ON VENUE IS PERMITTED**

### **STABLING**

- The BEDDING surface provided will be sawdust
- Each stable will be supplied with a minimum of 100mm sawdust cover
- Additional sawdust will be available.

### **CARAVANS/CAMPING SITES**

- Camping site allocations will be issued at the Secretary’s Office upon arrival.

NOTE:

- **No horses are allowed in the camping area for safety reasons.**
- Power must not be accessed from any sources other than those provided for camping sites by the Organising Committee.
- **ALL POWER LEADS MUST BE TAGGED BY A LICENCED ELECTRICIAN PRIOR TO ARRIVAL.** Inspections of the campground will be undertaken by AI3DE staff and by SA Government Technical Regulators during the event. Any lead which is not tagged will be confiscated. There will be no exceptions to this rule.
- **Power leads MUST not be run along the ground at any time.** Any lead found on the ground will be confiscated or rendered inoperable. AI3DE MUST comply with all relevant safety legislation and we ask your cooperation in this matter. Please refer to the campground guide attached to this document for more information.

### **FODDER**

- It is strongly suggested that orders be placed prior to your arrival. Details are included.

### **NON-COMPETITIVE HORSES**

- Competitors are asked not to bring non-competitive horses, unless prior arrangements are made. If a non-competitive horse is brought, it MUST go through the Arrival Examination.

### **TIMETABLE & DRAW**

- Draws will be conducted at the conclusion of the first horse inspection, Thursday 12 November 2:00pm
- Dressage times for all classes will be available after the completion of the first horse inspection and will be available from the Secretary’s Office and posted on the Stable Notice Board.
- Cross Country times will be available after the completion of the Dressage Phase and will be available from the Secretary’s Office and posted on the Stable Notice Board.

## **INSURANCES**

- All owners and competitors are personally responsible for any and all damage to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents and/or their horses. You are strongly advised to take out third party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

## **RIDERS WELCOME BBQ**

- This year's pre event BBQ will be held at 7:00pm on Wednesday 11 November in the 4\* Supporters Hub Marquee, Rymill Park presented by Richardson Constructions.

## **BLACK TIE TROT UP COCKTAIL PARTY**

## **LAST JUMP PARTY**

- The Last Jump Party will be held after the completion of the Show Jumping and Official Presentations on Sunday 15 November in the Corporate Marquee in Rymill Park. This will be a ticketed event. Riders, grooms, volunteers, officials and owners will be admitted free of charge. Please collect your tickets, including those for your grooms and owners, from the Event Secretary's Office during the event.

## **CATERING**

- Catering will be provided in Victoria Park and through Food Vans located around the venue. More details available on arrival.

## **ACCOMODATION**

- To enable officials/security to be able to contact you during the event, all competitors must provide contact details. For those staying on the venue – campsite number and mobile phone number, and those not staying on the venue must provide their name, address and offsite contact phone number. This is in case a problem arises with your horse and you need to be contacted.

## **HORSE AND ATHLETE WELFARE**

- Article 519 CONTROL OF MEDICATION  
The control of Medication for Horses must be conducted in accordance with the 'General Regulations' and the 'Veterinary Regulations'.
- Article 520 ABUSE OF HORSE AND DANGEROUS RIDING.  
Any rider who affects the safety of any horse, rider or third party will be considered to have acted dangerously and will be penalised accordingly.  
Any act or series of actions that in the opinion of the Ground Jury can be defined as abuse of a horse or dangerous riding shall be penalised by disqualification and such other penalties in accordance with the "General Regulations", Article 163 or Article 523 of the present Rules as the Ground Jury may determine. Such acts include for example:

- Rapping
- Riding an exhausted horse
- Excessive pressing of a tired horse
- Riding an obviously lame horse
- Excessive use of whip and/or spurs
- Dangerous riding

Officials must report such actions as soon as possible to the Ground Jury through the Secretary of the Organising Committee or Control Centre of the event as appropriate, supported where possible by a statement from one or more witnesses. The Ground Jury must decide if there is a case to be answered. Any individual member of the Ground Jury who observes such actions, has the right and the duty to disqualify the competitor forthwith on his own authority.

## **FEI CODE OF CONDUCT**

### **FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE**

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

### **RIDER CO-ORDINATORS AT CCI'S**

- It is a requirement of all International events to appoint "Rider Co-ordinators" for the event. This important initiative has been proposed by the International Riders Association (IRA) and approved by the FEI Eventing Committee, and is intended to improve communication in general between riders and officials.
- The objective is to establish the Rider Co-ordinators as the focus when serious concerns are expressed by riders. The idea is for the Co-ordinator to meet with the Ground Jury and/or Technical Delegate to discuss any rider concerns over fences, ground conditions, roping and course distance etc. (This is particularly important at the start of events).
- The Rider Co-ordinators are to be chosen from a list of suitably qualified riders (where possible with 3\* & 4\* experience) supplied by IRA to the FEI who are entered to ride at the event.
- In the past, channels of communication between riders and officials have not always been clear. It has been easy to be 'wise after the event', and hopefully this initiative will

improve cooperation between all parties making it possible to be 'wise at the event', particularly for the welfare of the horses and safety of the riders.

- There is a mandatory meeting of Rider Co-ordinators with the Ground Jury and/or Technical Delegate on the night before cross-country in addition to any further meetings. If the weather conditions necessitate any worries, changes to the optimum time and length of phases should be made in the interest of safety to horses and riders, to maintain the fairness of the competition.

### **AUSTRALIAN SPORTS DRUG AGENCY**

- ASDA is working with the organisers of the event to deter athletes from using banned drugs and doping practices. ASDA's "Drugs in Sport Hotline" provides a confidential toll-free information service to athletes and coaches on permitted and restricted medications. Call 1800 020 506 for more information.
- **Check the Status of Substances**  
As an athlete, you are responsible for any substances found in your system. ASDA recommends that you always check the status of medications and other related products (prior to use) by calling the ASDA Drugs in Sport Hotline on 1800 020 506 during business hours or by visiting the On-Line Medications in Sport List via the ASDA web site ([www.asda.org.au](http://www.asda.org.au)). The website also provides further information on checking substances, your rights and responsibilities.
- ASDA supports pure performance in sport and believes athletes should achieve their personal best through hard work and dedication. We look forward to working with you to protect the value of sport.

### **COMPETITOR BRIEFING –THURSDAY 12 NOVEMBER, 10.00am.**

- The competitor briefing is when the key officials are introduced, course plans are issued and any 'house keeping' regulations advised. Competitors have the opportunity to ask questions about any issues. Following the briefing, competitors are officially shown the phases of the cross-country test under the direction of the Technical Delegate/s and Course Designer.

### **FALLS**

- All horses and riders who have a heavy fall must be examined by a veterinarian and/or doctor as appropriate, before they either take part on another horse or leave the competition site.

### **PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR**

- The wearing of protective headgear is compulsory at all times whilst mounted. Refer to the Australian Standards for helmet requirements.
- All riders please note that appropriate headgear must be worn when riding pushbikes, scooters, or motorbikes as all parklands are deemed to be a public area. The police have warned that if caught without protective headgear, you will be fined accordingly.
- Competitors may wear Top hats for the final warm up and during the Dressage Competition. Hard hats are required at all other times.

### **VETERINARY MATTERS**

- Competitors are not permitted to have in their possession any syringes, needles or any prohibited substances.

- All veterinary treatment or medication of a horse whilst on the venue must be approved by the Veterinary Delegate using the FEI Authorisation Forms for Treatment. Forms are available from the Veterinarians or the Secretary's Office.
- If veterinary care is required after hours, contact the Stable Master-
- The use of acupuncture or physical therapy (eg. physiotherapy, hydrotherapy, heat treatment, etc.) to horses whilst on the venue must be approved by means of the Authorisation Form for Emergency Treatment.
- Injections of normal nutrients such as saline fluids, electrolyte solutions and glucose may be administered only with the written approval of the Veterinary Delegate.
- Any veterinary treatment of horses should be done by the Treating Veterinarian.
- If competitor's private veterinarians treat any horses, this must be reported to the Veterinary Delegate **BEFORE** any treatment is given.

### **OBJECTIONS/QUERIES**

- If any competitor has a query about their results, the procedure is to first submit a query form to the Secretary, who will then pass it on to the appropriate department. The competitor will then be advised of the result. If the competitor is not happy with the result of the query, then an objection may be lodged.
- Objections must be lodged in writing, signed by the authorised person making the objection and presented to the Secretary who will in turn present the objection to the President of the Ground Jury. Any supporting evidence and witnesses should be lodged with the objection. A fee of CHF 150 (Aust \$150) is required.
- Objections must be lodged within the following time limits: -
  - Against the eligibility of a competitor or horse or to the conditions of the arena – not less than 30 minutes before the start of the relevant competition.
  - To the cross-country course or obstacles – not later than 1800 hours on the day before the relevant competition.
  - Concerning irregularities or incidents during a competition, or the classification of a competitor – not later than 30 minutes after the announcement of the marks being posted.
